## PRESENTERS & FACILITATORS

**Tricia Zebrowski, Ph.D., CCC-SLP**, is a professor in the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders at the University of Iowa. Her research, teaching and clinical interest is childhood stuttering, especially during adolescence. Since 1998, Tricia has directed UISPEAKS for Teens, a week-long summer residential program for teenagers who stutter held at the University of Iowa. A frequent presenter at professional conferences, Tricia is a long-time FRIENDS supporter and regularly presents at one-day workshops and the national convention.

**Lee Caggiano, M.A., CCC-SLP, BCS-F** is the co-founder and director of FRIENDS. She has developed and coordinated workshops for children who stutter, families, and professionals for the past twenty-five years. She has presented at local and national conferences regarding the needs of children who stutter. Lee is a Board Certified Specialist in Fluency Disorders and Director of Stuttering Therapy and Resources of Northern Colorado. Lee is an adjunct professor at NYU and Queens College.

**Kristin Mangan, M.A., CCC-SLP** is an Assistant Professor and Speech-Language Pathologist at the Child Development and Rehabilitation Center at Oregon Health and Science University

(OHSU) in Portland, Oregon. She has specialized in stuttering, as well as feeding and swallowing, for the past 18 years. Kristin attended the Stuttering Foundation's western Workshop in 2013 and has worked closely with FRIENDS to run workshops at the annual and ODCs. She has presented both regionally and nationally on the subject of stuttering to children, parents, and other professionals.

**Tiffani Kittilstved, M.S., CCC-SLP** is a speech-language pathologist at several private practices around the Washington area. She is the chapter leader of the National Stuttering Association Seattle/Tacoma Family Chapter and a person who stutters. She has been involved with FRIENDS for the past several years and led the Friends ODC in Seattle last year—very excited to be bringing FRIENDS back this year!

**Elyse Lambeth M.S., CCC-SLP, BCS-F** graduated from the University of Redlands with her master's degree in communicative disorders in 2006, and received her board certification in fluency disorders in 2017. She runs the fluency clinic at Seattle Children's Hospital, co-facilitates the annual Seattle Stuttering Camp for Teens at the University of Washington, and has coordinated support groups and a FRIENDS workshop.
